he Board of Directors would like to thank outgoing board member Deb Metzger for her six years of service to Friends. During her time on the board, she was the chair of the annual plant sales and horticulture committees. She also served on the finance team, Garden Party and On the Terrace at 5! events and volunteered with the Shop in the Gardens.

Following are comments from Deb regarding her time serving the Friends organization.

PLANT SALES

"Of all the committees I have served on the plant sale has been my favorite and I hope to continue to be active with this event. I steered these various sales events, but our very talented volunteers were the ones that went to the nurseries to choose both popular and unusual plants. Most of the volunteers are master gardeners who

also grew vegetables from seeds and nurtured the plants up to the day of the sale.

Our spring sale was always followed by the planting of mum plugs in early summer and then sold in September. The bulbs were also sold in the Fall at a separate sale close to the time of planting. We have also had dahlia tubers and succulent sales. Through working with these volunteers, I was also able to gain more knowledge on gardening than I could have ever imagined. I am so grateful for the friendships made with this group and for their dedication and hard work to make these fundraisers a success. I am also thankful for the support from the garden staff of Mill Creek Metroparks and look forward to continuing to work with all of them in the future."



HORTICULTURE

"For several years I have managed the educational horticultural events. I relied on area master gardeners who had connections and contacts across the United States and here in Ohio for speakers and programs that would appeal to diverse audiences. It was rewarding to meet the speakers and bring programs to our community. This past year we collaborated with the Gardeners of Greater Youngstown for an all-day seminar in February that brought together about 80 gardeners for a day of learning and fellowship and we look forward to future collaborations next winter."

SPRING AT THE GARDENS:

A Season of Renewal and Transformation By Lisa Frederick



pring's arrival is heralded by the gentle awakening of nature—the slow unfurling of vibrant colors and the return of life and energy throughout the Gardens. From the moment visitors arrive, they are welcomed by beautifully redesigned landscaped beds completed in the summer of 2024 near the parking area, brimming with a carefully curated array of perennials. These beds serve as a vivid prelude to the seasonal splendor ahead.

The Head Gardener, Marcy Dubec, and the entire Garden Staff are diligently overseeing various new plantings and projects initiated in the fall of 2024, with anticipation of an even more spectacular display of colors and textures as the season progresses.


Visitors will observe significant alterations preceding the main Gardens entrance. Large construction fences now encircle the Children's Garden in preparation for a much-anticipated Groundbreaking Ceremony and landscape renovation project, set to begin June 12. This transformative undertaking is expected to last approximately seven months, contingent on weather conditions. In anticipation of the completed project, the outdoor restrooms were upgraded and completed in early spring with heating and insulation, ensuring their readiness upon the Children's Garden's grand reopening. Utilities and greenhouse tunnels were also relocated—an effort completed in April—to make way for this exciting addition.


The Dahlia Garden, lovingly and meticulously curated and tended by Stan Vuletich, will also find a new home in the Main Lawn QRS beds, which include three large seasonal display areas. Meanwhile, over 20,000 annuals, propagated from tiny 1-inch plugs since autumn, have been carefully nurtured in preparation for planting throughout the Garden beds in June. Tropical plants, which overwintered in the Margaret Cushwa Outdoor Education Building due to the relocation of the greenhouse tunnels, will soon bring their exotic flair to the Long Mall and to containers placed throughout the Gardens.

The Muransky Perennial Walk has blossomed into a fragrant tapestry of color, featuring an eclectic mix of blooming perennials that delight visitors creating an enchanting atmosphere as they leisurely stroll through the Gardens. Improvements aimed at enhancing the Total Garden Experience are not only underway—they are already bearing fruit. A particular highlight is the collection of 75 David Austin English Garden Shrub Roses, planted just last spring around the Gazebo. These prized varieties are now flourishing, offering their signature fragrance, elegant form, and rich color palettes.

Numerous improvements have been planned and executed to enhance the Total Garden Experience. Several improvement projects are concurrently underway throughout the Gardens. Notably, Brickwell Masonry has been contracted to specialize in replacing all damaged flagstone on the South Terrace surrounding the Kidston Pavilion. Garden staff member Luke Manary has completely reimagined the T bed—located off the southwest corner of the North Terrace—which will soon feature a vibrant mix of trees, shrubs, and new perennials. The two Knot Gardens, framing the side entrance to the Davis Center and the DeYor Concourse, are also slated for complete renovation using shade-tolerant plantings. Finally, the Price Road entrance sign will be beautifully refreshed with a new design and plantings of shade-loving shrubs and perennials, including Helleborus Merlin in charming shades of pink and purple, complemented by cheerful daffodils.

As spring deepens and the Gardens awaken in full, each new bloom and project speaks to a larger story of renewal, vision, and care. Whether you're a first-time guest or a longtime admirer, now is the perfect moment to witness the Gardens' ongoing transformation—where every path leads to discovery, and every blossom tells a story of beauty and growth.

I now live in a retirement community. Ohio Living allows the residents to plant gardens around their villas. I continue to have gardens with all my favorite plants.


